



Liza is the founder and CEO of The Cirlot Agency, a global brand strategy, public relations, and business development firm with offices in Jackson, MS, and Washington, DC. Over the past 40 years, the firm has grown to represent publicly traded companies and privately held corporations, domestically and internationally. It has also become known as one of the nation's leading aerospace defense communications agencies. Recently, Liza was appointed to the National Defense Industrial Association's (NDIA) Washington, D.C., Chapter Board of Directors for 2025, representing over 15,000 members united to provide diverse expertise in addressing national security challenges.

A Mississippi University for Women and Harvard Business School graduate, Liza has expanded her studies to include several international business fellowships and special assignments. Liza has served as Chairman of the Mississippi World Trade Center board and was awarded the organization's highest honor, the Tozzoli International Business Leadership Award. As a testament to her international business acumen, Liza's experience includes representing clients in Europe, South America, and the Middle East. A career highlight in



1998, Liza was asked by NATO to help devise a communications plan regarding the Bosnian land mine crisis to give the citizens of Bosnia a voice in their government and worked with Her Majesty's Engineer in England to facilitate the plan.

Liza began her career as an advertising account executive at *The Clarion-Ledger*, the largest daily newspaper in Mississippi. From there, she worked for the state's largest advertising agency. She spent time in the political arena during the Reagan/Bush era, working as Communications Director of the state's Republican Party.



Liza established The Cirlot Agency in 1984 with a mere \$78 state tax return check. She received her first words of encouragement when she opened the Agency's bank account, and the officer said, "Go get 'em, Tiger!" (Which she's been doing ever since.) Four years later, Liza met and married Rick Looser, a corporate communications specialist, who joined the firm as President/COO.



Key recognitions for Liza include being named one of Mississippi's Top CEO's by *Mississippi Business Journal* and receiving the Silver Medal Award from the American Advertising Federation of Jackson, which recognizes professionals who have made outstanding contributions to the advertising industry. Among the Agency's many awards and accolades

is the Corporate World Class Supplier Award presented annually by Northrop Grumman Corporation.

The Cirlot Agency was one of ten suppliers in the United States who consistently demonstrated outstanding achievements and support of Northrop Grumman programs.

Additional notoriety includes the prestigious Blue Chip Enterprise Initiative Award, a national competition recognizing companies that have overcome adversity to enjoy great success. The Cirlot



Agency has also been named a Business & Industry Super Achiever, as well as "Business of the Year" by the Greater Jackson Chamber Partnership.

Over the past 40 years, The Cirlot Agency has won over a thousand professional industry awards from such associations as the American Advertising Federation, the Public Relations Society of America, the Public Relations Association of Mississippi, the International Association of Business Communicators, the National Telly Awards, and the Association of Marketing and Communication Professionals international Hermes Creative Awards.

By working for global corporations in the aerospace and defense industry, including Textron, Northrop Grumman, Bell Helicopter, Elbit Systems of America, Raytheon, Boeing, and more, the Agency has become known as one of the leading aerospace defense communication firms in the nation. This work includes leading a team of defense industry giants to what became one of the most significant defense contracts ever awarded, a testament to the Agency's expertise in market intelligence, strategy, creative development, and integrated communications.

In 2008, the University of Mississippi hired The Cirlot Agency to provide strategic planning, brand development, and public relations expertise for the first 2008 Presidential Debate. The Cirlot team supported over 3,000 national and international journalists in Oxford, Mississippi, for the event. In addition to a successful debate, the university earned the advertising equivalency of \$35 million in positive publicity. Liza served as chief communications strategist.



As a gift to the state of Mississippi, the Agency created a Public Service Campaign entitled, "Mississippi, Believe It!" (www.MississippiBelieveIt.com). The Campaign, which began as an educational tool directed to Mississippi's youth, depicts positive aspects of Mississippi and the success of its citizens. Campaign posters and teacher lesson plans were delivered to every public and private school and every college and university in the state. The Agency donated over \$500,000 in time and resources to give back to the state in which it was established. The Campaign has garnered national media exposure, having been featured in such publications as The New York Times, USA Today, U.S. News & World Report, The Christian Science Monitor, The Washington Post, The Washington Times, and The International Herald Tribune, and on NBC's Today Show, National Public Radio, Fox News Radio, and numerous talk radio shows across the country. It is estimated that the "Mississippi Believe It!" Campaign has amassed the equivalent of over \$40 million in media exposure, and as it has gone viral, an estimated 120 million people have been exposed to the Campaign.

An active economic development advocate, Liza was named Volunteer of the Year by the Mississippi Economic Development Council (MEDC) in recognition of her significant contributions to economic development and industrial growth within the metro Jackson area. Liza set a precedent by serving as the first woman chairman of the MetroJackson Chamber of Commerce board – a first in its 116-year history. Repeating this tradition, Liza is also the first woman named president of the Mississippi World Trade Center.

Liza was appointed Chairman of the Board of the Center of Innovation and Entrepreneurship at the University of Mississippi and served from 2019 - 2022. During that time, she was instrumental in founding the CIE annual student entrepreneurship event, the REDe Summit, and the Legacy Leadership program designed to support the generational sustainment of family-owned businesses, all hosted by the Ole Miss School of Business. Most recently, Liza received the University of

Mississippi Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship 2023 Farrington Distinguished Entrepreneur of the Year Award.

Liza is married to Rick Looser. They have a daughter who lives in Los Angeles and a son and daughter-in-law who reside in Washington, DC.
